Bayview Farms Pony Club Riding Center and Oak Knoll Equestrian Pony Club Riding Center invite you to join us at the “Everything But The Horse Rally” (EBTH). This is a fantastic way to learn and enjoy the USPC Rally experience without bringing your horse along; your “rides” will be done on foot. While you won’t bring your horse, you will want to bring EVERYTHING else including your riding skills, horse knowledge, and team effort. Here is some helpful information:

Teams will set up tack rooms outside (no horse trailer needed this year) and prepare for this one day rally, as if it were a competition with their horse present. That means complete preparation of saddle, tack, riding attire (including medical armbands), and rally kits. Competitors will not need to bring feed for horses, but you will bring buckets and any items you would use to feed and hydrate your horse if he/she was there.

RULES: This rally will be governed by the 2021 USPC Horse Management Handbook and the 2021 USPC Eventing Rulebook and current Annual Newsletters. Parents and EBTH participants are encouraged to go to secure.ponyclub.org and click on Rulebooks to view the most current Horse Management and Eventing Rulebooks. It is also essential to review the 2021 newsletters for both Eventing and Horse Management which will be posted soon. **IMPORTANT: Copies of these rulebooks and Newsletters will be part of the required equipment in each team’s tackroom at EBTH.**

TEAMS: Each team will consist of 3-4 riders at Unrated, D-1, D-2, and D-3 levels, a Stable Manager (who must be either an Unrated or a D rated member), and a C Advisor. Members certified higher than D-3 but who have never attended a rally are also welcome to participate. Each rider will have a formal inspection. Each team must have a chaperone (older than 21, chaperones may also be volunteers). If a club does not have a complete team, they may call other clubs to make up a “scratch” team or send in such entries to be placed on a scratch team by the Organizer.

ATTIRE: Attire guidelines are found in the 2021 Eventing Rulebook Article 15 (Safety- pg. 5) and Article 36 (Competitor Attire- pg. 11). For unrated and D members proper dressage and Show Jumping attire is optional- please refer to section on D attire in referenced section of rulebook for specifics.

SCORES: Scores will be based on your Written Test (Study guide to be sent out closer to event), Dressage Test, Stadium Jumping Score and Horse Management scores (which include Turn-Out Inspection and Required Equipment/Tack Room Set-up).

C-ADVISORS: This rally is for unrated, D-level, and Pony Club members who have never attended rallies. ALL teams need to have a C-advisor from their own or another club. C-Advisors are welcome and encouraged to volunteer at EBTH as it provides a terrific teaching and mentoring opportunity for all involved. No rally participation fees are charged to C-Advisors. C- Advisors must wear medical armbands at EBTH.

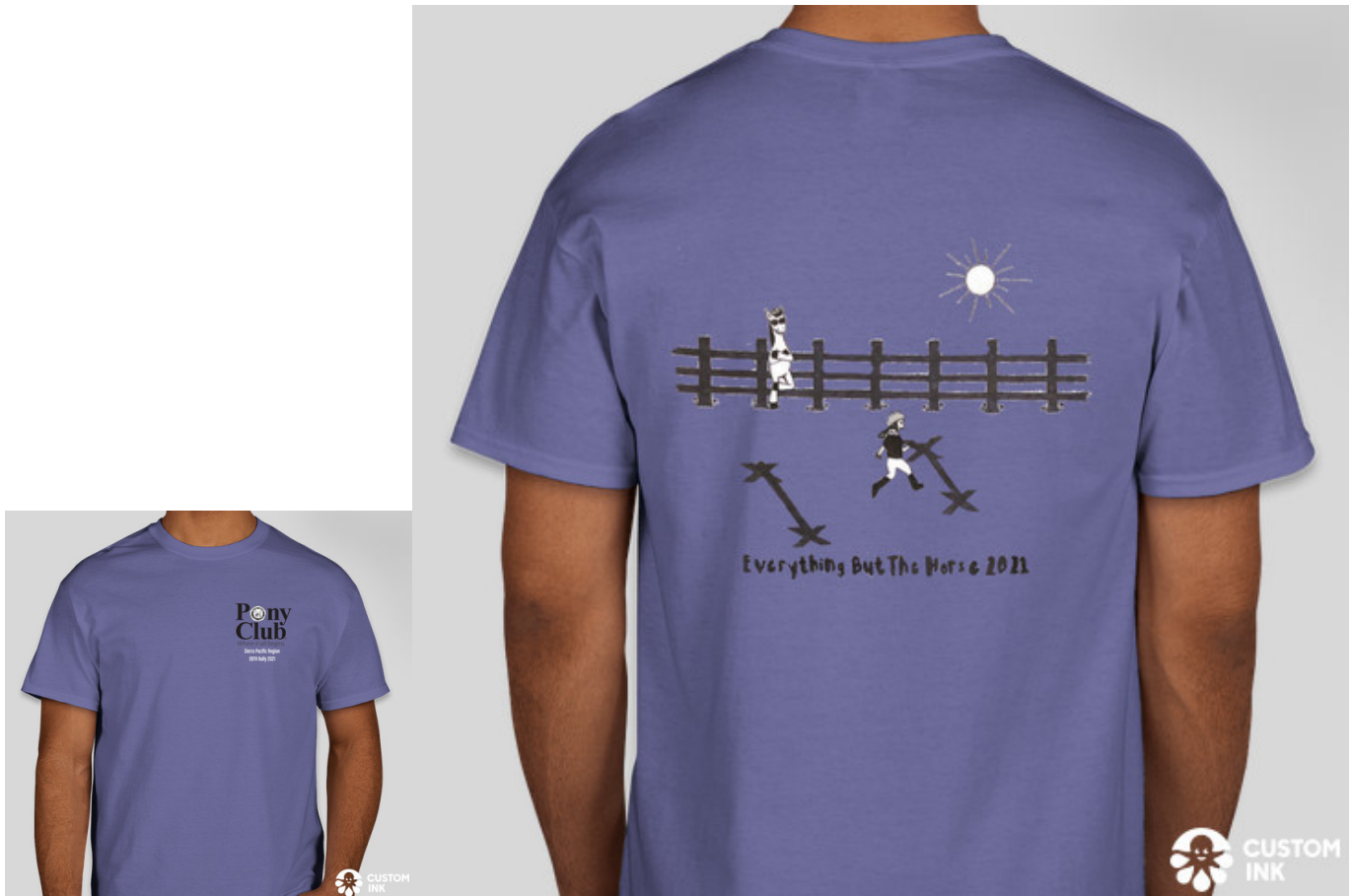
LUNCH: Pre-orders will be taken for lunch, which includes a Classic Italian Sub Sandwich on Ciabata, with potato chips and a cookie; a Turkey and Cheese Sub Sandwich, with chips and a cookie; a Garden Salad with Grilled Chicken Breast and Herb Vinaigrette; and Grilled Vegetable Wrap and a Cutie. Lunch is optional and other items will also be for sale in the snack bar. Please remember to include lunch orders for any interested family members who will be attending.

VIRTUAL OPTION: A Virtual Rally option will also be organized by Six Rivers Pony Club and is available to those uncomfortable with attending an in-person rally at this time. The virtual version takes place on the same day. A schedule will be provided.

Individuals/Clubs will be responsible for setting up a dressage court and the provided jumping course. Zoom sessions with judges will be scheduled. Covid-19 guidelines must be followed.

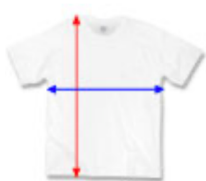
EBTH 2021 T-Shirt**

COVID-19 Protocols and Mandatory Requirements for Rally Participants

Rally participants are required to comply with these and any additional rally requirements while on competition grounds. Failure to do so may result in expulsion from the grounds.

Competition Access

- Rally participants, and/or their parents, are required to self-monitor their temperature and for COVID-19 symptoms at least once daily prior to arrival. Anyone with a temperature below 100.4° F (38° C) may enter the facility. Prior to the rally, participants should regularly have their temperatures checked and recorded to identify a personal normal temperature.
- Anyone who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/symptoms-testing/symptoms.htm>) or has been in contact with someone who has exhibited COVID-19 symptoms or tested positive for COVID-19 within the last two weeks, may not attend the competition. Anyone who violates these requirements will be asked to leave.
- Rally participants are required to wear a face covering when not mounted.
***Participants with health issues that preclude them from wearing a face covering are exempt from the requirement but are required to maintain a 6' social distance at all times.*
***A competitor choosing to wear a face covering when mounted cannot be penalized for doing so.*

Social Distancing and Cleaning

- Comply with social distancing requirements at all times while on the competition grounds.
- Wash hands often, provide and use hand sanitizer, gloves, masks, and other PPE as recommended.
- The team chaperone is responsible for overseeing social distancing compliance during rally competition. They may not act as a member of the team or perform any competitor related duties. For teams with members all above the age of 18, they will be responsible for reminding each other to maintain social distancing protocols.

Reporting

Any rally participant who tests positive for COVID-19 within 14 days of the conclusion of competition is encouraged to notify the rally organizer. If made aware of a positive test, the organizer must then notify USPC, but no identifying information will be included.

Parents, Volunteers, and Chaperones

All parents, volunteers, and chaperones must comply with these USPC policies and are expected to commit to modeling the appropriate behaviors.

Appendix III Chaperone Form

*To be completed by the chaperone and turned in with the rally entry for
USPC members below the age of majority.*

Chaperone duties shall include:

1. The primary function of the "Official Team Chaperone" is to ensure that there is a contact person for every USPC member below the age of majority, on the grounds for the duration of the competition.
2. While multiple Chaperone Forms may be turned in for a single team, only one person will be designated the Official Team Chaperone. If the Official Team Chaperone must leave the grounds during the competition, they must delegate the team chaperone duties to another responsible adult, making it clear that they are to respond to rally officials and any team members in your absence.
3. Be present and available to rally officials and all team members for the duration of the competition.
4. Being in contact with parents/guardians for all team members during competition hours.
5. Being in contact with all team members and their parents/guardians outside of competition hours.
6. Have copy of and be familiar with the current discipline rulebook and the current Horse Management Handbook and Rules for rallies. Rulebooks available for download from www.ponyclub.org.
7. Be aware that USPC members are required to wear a current, up to date USPC medical card/bracelet on their arm at all USPC activities.
8. Be familiar with the effects of heat and humidity and the potential risk for heat related illness. Take an active role in helping to keep all team members well hydrated and take every opportunity to encourage water breaks.
9. Uphold USPC Substances and Weapons Policy which prohibits the inappropriate or illegal use of any substance, including but not limited to drugs or alcohol, by anyone participating in any manner. Weapons of any kind are forbidden. Refer to About/About the Organization/By-Laws, Policies and Resolutions on www.ponyclub.org for the full policy statement.
10. Remember that administration of medications is the sole responsibility of the parent/guardian.

Appendix III Emergency Contact Form
